Mission

Mission of the Indonesia Dragonfly Society (IDS) is to pursue the creation of sustainable biodiversity of dragonfly (Odonata) as Indonesia's natural heritage. Indonesia Dragonfly Society also committed to keeping records and monitoring dragonflies in Indonesia.

Objectives

Our objectives are conducting a research of dragonflies and their habitats for conservation, attempting to improve dragonfly habitat and utilize it in the aspect of cultural, ecological, and economical, together with the community, and conducting a public education and conservation campaign of dragonfly.

The History

Indonesia Dragonfly Society was established in Malang East Java at 15th September 2010 by Wahyu Sigit Rahadi.
