The results of this project directly collaborate with five actions (see below) of the National Action Plan for the Conservation of Northeast Primates (PAN PriNe) organized by Chico Mendes Institute for Biodiversity Conservation, the Brazilian conservation agency. The PAN PriNe is a public policy in which different public and private sectors of civil society participate in collaboration for the conservation of Brazilian biodiversity.
